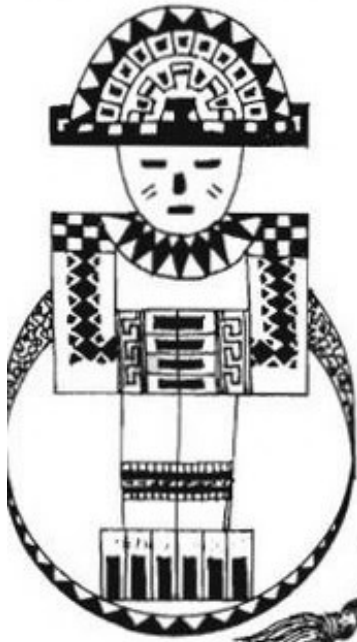

Captain George S. ALLEN, USN, was born in Syracuse, New York on 27 May 1935, and graduated from Colgate University in 1957. He was commissioned Ensign, U.S. Naval Reserve, in August 1957 through OCS, and augmented to United States Navy in 1960.

In August 1957, Captain Allen reported aboard **USS CHARLES S. SPERRY (DD-697)**, and served as First Lieutenant and later as Weapons Officer. He subsequently served as Executive Officer in **USS VIGOR (MSO-47)** from July 1960 until May 1962. Following this tour, he was assigned to the Officer Performance Division of the Bureau of Naval Personnel. Returning to sea, he reported to **USS BRONSTEIN (FF-1037)** as Executive Officer, serving in that billet from June 1964 until July 1966. After attending the Command and Staff Course, Naval War College at Newport, Captain Allen again served a tour in the Bureau of Naval Personnel in the Officer Distribution Division. Thereafter he commanded **USS MCCLOY (FF-1038)** from July

1969 to January 1971.

Following an assignment as Director, Surface Warfare Officers School (Basic), at Newport, R.I., he reported as prospective Commanding Officer, **USS MACDONOUGH (DDG-39)** on 21 January 1974, and recommissioned MACDONOUGH after a 14 month AAW modernization on 4 May 1974.

MACDONOUGH subsequently deployed in the summer of 1975 to Northern Europe as Flagship for Commander, Standing Naval Force Atlantic. Relieved in May 1976, Captain Allen then attended the Senior Course, Naval War College, Newport. He served as Deputy Director, Surface Warfare Manpower and Training Requirements Division (OP 39) in OPNAV from July 1977 to July 1979.

Awards include the Legion of Merit, Meritorious Service and Navy Commendation Medals.
